- Specialty awareness talks for groups (SAR, workplaces, etc)
- Companion Rescue Clinics
- Avalanche Fundamentals with Field Course for human powered/non-motorized and motorized users
- Elementary, Middle, and High School Student Awareness Classes, these can include Avalanche Demo board, Know Before You Go video & Lecture, Avalanche Rescue basics with a Mobile Beacon Park, and Backcountry Preparedness.
